It has felt really positive to see everyone return to school with renewed energy this week. Half term obviously provided much needed rest. I was particularly pleased to see so many parents attend our maths open classroom today. Maths is a great subject and conquering a new maths skill feels particularly rewarding. Fear of maths can set in early if we are not careful however. In school, maths is a positive experience but there is no doubt that children can quickly decide that they are not good at maths and a lack of confidence with one area, such as number fluency, can hold children back in all areas of maths learning. We always tell children that if they know they are weak in a certain area -such as knowing their number bonds to 10 or 100 or being able to recall times table facts, they have the power to change this! Simply spending more time practising what they find hard will make a difference. Setting themselves a goal and focussing on one thing at a time will also make a difference. Regular practise of anything hard is a skill that will set children up for success throughout school. I hope that you enjoyed the session that you attended today and that it might encourage you to spend a little more time working mathematically with your child.

EYFS at Argyle Primary School - Reception

As this week marked the beginning of a new half term, Reception class begun the exploration of 'Traditional Tales.' This unit will span over a number of weeks, so that the children can hear a range of traditional tales and learn to retell them. The first traditional tale that the children are learning is Goldilocks and the Three Bears. At the start of the week, the children were shown a range of objects from the story and were asked to guess which story they related to. They then heard the story and have spent the rest of the week learning it off by heart, adding key actions to help them remember.



Also this week, the children have been learning about Bonfire night and that it is celebrated on the 5th of November each year. The children talked about different fireworks that they have seen and also thought about how to stay safe.

Finally, the teachers have been working with each individual pupil to see how many sounds they remember. They will be using these assessments to help plan the next steps in their teaching. They will soon be sending these assessments home so that you can continue to support your child with their learning of phonics.

Our development matters

Personal, Social and Emotional:

The children have been using a range of role play equipment to help them act out the story of Goldilocks and the Three Bears.

Mathematics:

As the traditional tale this week explores different sizes, the children have been drawing small, medium and large

beds for the three bears. You can help your child at home by using the language of size such as tiny, small, medium, large, huge.

Understanding the World:

This week the children have been making porridge. They learnt about what happens to the porridge oats when liquid

is added, and then added salt to one and sugar to the other. The children tasted the two different bowls and discussed their favourite.









EYFS at Argyle Primary School - Nursery

The children in Nursery have now begun their new topic 'Heroes.' They have started to explore a range of real life heroes and have thought about different types of jobs. The children talked about how jobs allow us to do something that we enjoy but also helps us to earn money to pay for important things like a home, food and clothing.

After listening to the story 'My Mum' by Anthony Browne, the children thought about how mummies and daddies are real life superheroes. They might not have special powers such as x-ray vision or super strength, but they do have other powers such as helping us to feel better when we are feeling sad!

Finally, the children spent a lot of time talking about staying safe in different situations. They talked about how to cross a road safety, how

to handle equipment such as sticks and how to move around the classroom and school safely.

Our development matters

Literacy:

As the children have been exploring the sound 's' they played a memory game where there had to remember the objects that started with the letter 's' that were hidden under the blanket. Developing memory is a critical skill and games like this help children to improve their retention skills.

Mathematics:

The children have been developing their counting skills and their understanding one more and one less. The tried to put the correct amount of objects into a pot and say what number would be one more/less.

Expressive Art and Design:

The children been trying to create their own still life images of pumpkins. They thought carefully about the colours they were choosing and the shape of the object that they were drawing.
