EYFS at Argyle Primary School - Nursery

In Nursery the children began the week by looking at a map of the world and



talking about how humans live on land (as do many other animals), but some animals live in water. After reading the story of 'The Very Noisy Foxes', the children learnt more about foxes and their habitat and how it has changed over the years. The children then had a go at sorting a range of animals into farm animals, wild animals and animals that can



be pets.

This week the children were visited by the Foundling Museum and met two bird puppets called Chit and

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Chat. The children worked together to find materials that they could use to create a nest for Chit and Chat and their baby chick. After collaborating on one large nest, the children had a go at making their own individual nests out of clay and leaves.
