




Year 5 Art— Modroc Sculptures

There's olive oil in the recipe. I didn't know if the bread would taste of olive oil but it tasted just like normal bread. **-Yacqub A**





Year 3's learning adventure

Literacy

On Wednesday, year 3 heard reports of a dragon sighting in and around the Key Stage 2 playground.

When they went down to investigate, they discovered lizard-like footprints leading into the Sci-Hi house. At the end of the trail they lifted some leaves and found a perfectly formed dragon's egg nestling below.



They have brought back the egg to the classroom, in the hope that the mother will come back.

Over the next few weeks you will see their amazing dragon paintings and read their legends about the slayers of Dragons and other mythical beasts.



Following their fascinating visit to The Place for Dance in the Autumn Term, year 3 have now begun their weekly workshops learning more about dance language and beginning to put together the piece that they will perform in The Place theatre in March.



First of all they looked at the different elements of dance (gesture, travelling, stillness, jumps and turns) and then they began to work on their own choreography.

3 Pearl have begun to investigate animal movement. In the first session they looked at the bone structure of different animals and thought about how it would affect the way that they move (monkey, dog, snake and bat). In session 2 they looked at animals with hydrostatic skeletons (no bones at all) and how the water in their bodies helps them to move (jellyfish, octopuses and worms, among many others).

Well done for being doggedly determined!










EYFS at Argyle Primary School - Reception

This week the children in Reception began their new unit of 'Exploring Dinosaurs.' On Monday, the children were surprised to find a large egg in the classroom and talked about what animal the egg might belong to. After reading

and segment words which is a key step in reading.




