We know that, once children find their motivation to have a go, that they can amaze themselves with the progress they make.

Year 6 visit The National Army Museum

Last Friday, Year 6 visited the National Army Museum in Chelsea to find out more about their history topic and answer their big question: How did World War Two affect our local area?

The children had the chance to look around the permanent exhibitions to find out about the history of the army including recruitment, uniforms, food, fitness and kit. They also had a workshop about the Blitz (the period of heavy bombing during the war) and the volunteers who helped civilians. They had to piece together sources of evidence to find out more about the jobs that people did. These included firefighters, Air-raid Wardens, nurses, the ATS (the

Auxiliary Territorial Service) of which the late queen was a member, and the Home Guard. In class, the children are reading *Goodnight Mr Tom* by Michelle Magorian and they were able to draw on what they'd learnt in the book to answer questions in the workshop.











Year 2 visit Holy Cross Church

On Wednesday our year 2 pupils visited Holy Cross to look at how the church has been decorated for Christmas and make connections between their Nativity performance and their understanding of religious celebrations.



Year 4 visit The British Museum

On Thursday 1st December, 4 Onyx visited the British Museum. We were going to see a presentation called How Roman was Roman Britain which considered change and continuity in the Roman period. For example, when the Romans came and built Londinium and their stone villas, did the Iron Age people begin to live in the same way? Or did they maintain their own lifestyles?

We found out so many fascinating facts!

Yusra: Iron Age people made houses out of straw, wood and mud but the Romans made theirs out of stone and cement and put clay tiles on the roofs.

Sorayah: In 43 AD, the Romans invaded Britain because they wanted to make their empire bigger. When Romans died, the rich people were buried in coffins but the poor were buried 2.5 metres underground.

Vanessa: Roman coins had emperors' faces and names on them. When Iron Age people saw Roman coins, they copied them. Iron Age people couldn't write so they used the Latin letters to write their kings' names.

Aaliyah: The Romans didn't change everything about Iron Age Life. But when they brought cooking items like frying pans and grills, the Iron

Age people copied them. Romans brought cherries, celery, asparagus, walnuts and cucumbers to Britain.

Yasin: In AD 43, when the Romans invaded Britain, they wanted everyone to live like Romans. But some Iron Age people were able to withstand this.

While we were there, we also visited the Roman mosaic displays as we're going to be making mosaics in art!

Thank you so much to all the parents who came with us and really helped us to enjoy this visit.









Religious Education in Year 3

In RE the children are learning about Raksha Bandhan, this ceremony in the Hindu religion, which celebrates and strengthens the bond between brothers and sisters.

Bloomsbury Football Tournament



EYFS at Argyle Primary School - Nursery

The week began with the children listening to the story of 'Fireman Small' by Wong Herbert Yee. They looked at images of firefighters and thought about what they do as part of their jobs. The child were then given the problem of a soft toy being stuck up high in the Nursery and they had to work together as firefighters to come up with a plan of rescue. They were able to identify the tools that would be useful during this type of emergency

and the tools that would be less useful.

The children then learnt the word 'emergency' and talked about different types of emergencies that can occur. After exploring a range of emergencies, the children were able to identify the correct emergency service that would be able to support. They also listened to range of sirens that the emergency services use and talked

about why they are used. The children had great fun making their own siren noises.

Mathematics:

This week the children have been learning about the number 6. They have looked at it in a range of representations and then tried to count out 6 objects or actions to help them consolidate their understanding.

Communication and Language:

Whilst the children have been learning about heroes, they have also been exploring superheroes and thinking about how their super powers are used to help others. This week, the children talked about Spiderman and how he helps

to fight crime. They then looked at a range of comic

strips and tried to use these as a stimulus for telling their own stories.








EYFS at Argyle Primary School - Reception



Our development matters

Personal, Social and Emotional Development:

Through the key text of the week, the children were able to identify the different characters' feelings. They talked about how the goats felt when they saw the troll and then considered why the troll had felt so cross.

Together, they were able to find better ways that the troll could have shown his emotions such as explaining how he was feeling and why.

Mathematics:

A key aspect of early mathematical development is the ability to subitise (know how many objects there are without counting them). This week, the children continued to reinforce this skill through playing games involving dice.





Expressive Art and Design:

After exploring a range of instruments and the sounds that they make, the children chose the ones that they felt would best represent the sound of the Billy goats 'trip-trapping' along the bridge. They practised playing these instruments in a range of ways such as loudly and quietly.
