Head Teacher's Message

Dear Parents/Carers,

If you read this newsletter regularly, you will know what an incredible array of learning experiences children enjoy at Argyle. You will know also that Ofsted judged Personal Development at Argyle to be outstanding in October 2022. You may not be aware just how inclusive we are - welcoming children from across the world, shortly after they arrive in London and welcoming children with a range of special needs. We believe that every member of our school community makes us a little richer.

You may also not know how we perform academically. Our inclusive approach means that we will not top league tables when they return in the Autumn, however, there are some really interesting headlines that we would like to share with you.

In Year 6 the percentage of children achieving the expected level in Reading, Writing and Maths was, in all three subjects, above the national figure.

To give an indication - our combined measure was 71% compared to a national combined of 59%.

At the higher standard (greater depth) 22% of our children achieved the higher standard in all three subjects compared to 14% across Camden -the national figure is likely to be much lower.

So, though we are never complacent, and know that data only tells part of our story, we do have much to be proud of at the end of a year in which we have worked our socks off! Thank you to you all for your support, have a fantastic summer!






BORROWBOX

• Always book dental, optician and GP appointments outside school hours where possible. If it can not be avoided, book them for after lunch, this way your child get full attendance marks for the day.

• If you have an appointment in the morning after 9.15am, please bring your child to school first to be marked into the register. Tell the office and they will arrange collection of your child so you make your appointment. Do not keep children at home for 9.30am or later appointments.

• Do not book holidays during term time. If there is an exceptional circumstance, you must complete a form from the office before booking your tickets. The headteacher will consider your request. You may be fined if you take your child out of school without permission.

 Download Parenthub and ensure you are connected to your child's account which will allow you to track your child's attendance daily.

• Prepare school things (uniform, bag, nomework etc.) the night before.



Reminders for the new school year

All parents of current pupils should be aware of their child/ren's new class for September. If not your letter is on ParentHub.

• All eligible pupils transitioning to Year 3 are asked to apply for Free School Meals on https://accountforms.camden.gov.uk/freeschoolmeals/

You are also reminded that Year 3 parents will have to pay for school lunches if not entitled to Free School Meals.

- School Meals are now £2.52 per day or £12.60 per week.
- School uniform is available to buy over the summer on scopay app, look under 'Products'
- School uniform ordered over the summer can be collected on Monday 1st September

and Tuesday 2nd September from 10am – 2pm.

- All pupils Nursery to Year 6 need a PE kit for September start.
- Reminder that all school shoes must be plain black, this includes PE shoes.
